# KJSP Keio Short-Term Japanese Studies Program [Summer]

Cutting-edge technology alongside enduring traditional culture, a history of rapid modernization and economic turnarounds, the weird and wonderful world of anime and manga, and much more--the Keio Short-Term Japanese Studies Program (KJSP) introduces international students with no prior knowledge of Japan or its language to Japan's past, present, and future.

Designed to present a broad and yet engaging look into Japan's culture and society, the two-week program--conducted entirely in English--covers a range of topics, from economics and politics to art and food culture, in addition to sessions in "Survival Japanese." After participating in lectures by leading experts in the field, students take part in hands-on activities and excursions to experience what they have just learned.

**Duration:** July 2 – 15, 2017 \*tentative **Location:** Keio University Hiyoshi Campus

(located in the Greater Tokyo Metropolitan Area)

**Application Period:** Early April \*tentative **Costs:** Approx. 230,000 JPY

**Accommodation:** Accommodation is included and will be arranged by Keio.

\*Participants of this summer program, unlike those of February KJSP, will mainly be international students.



Applicants must be enrolled as full-time students in an undergraduate (bachelor's level) or graduate (master's level) program at a university\* and must not be currently studying in Japan. Participants must be fluent in English. No Japanese proficiency is required as all lectures and excursions are conducted in English.

\*Applicants enrolled at one of Keio's student-exchange partner universities or APRU member universities will be given priority.
